5. Pay for Chores:


Give money for completed chores, not just as an allowance.

Encourage kids to wait before buying, especially for bigger purchases.


7. Practice Giving:



SUPER BOWL



The Super Bowl is the biggest football game in the United States, and it's one of the most-watched games on TV. Roman numerals are used to mark each Super Bowl. The first Super Bowl in 1967 was Super Bowl I. The 2026 Super Bowl is LX, which stands for 60.

★ 10 FUN SUPER BOWL FACTS FOR KIDS ★

1. **Each team gets lots of footballs.** Super Bowl teams each receive 108 footballs—54 for practice and 54 for the game. Extra balls are used for kicking plays.
2. **Super Bowl Sunday is the second-biggest food day in the U.S.** Only Thanksgiving sees more food eaten in one day. Americans eat nearly 8 million pounds of guacamole and over 1.4 billion chicken wings during the big game!
3. **The 2011 Super Bowl was the most-watched TV event ever in the U.S.** About 169 million people saw at least part of the game; at any given moment, there was an average audience of 111 million.
4. **The Steelers and Patriots have the most Super Bowl wins.** Both teams have six wins. The Patriots and Denver Broncos share the record for most losses, with five each.
5. **Tom Brady is the top Super Bowl quarterback.** He has won six Super Bowls, played in nine, and received four MVP awards. He's often called the GOAT—Greatest of All Time.
6. **Most Super Bowls are held in warm cities.** Over half have taken place in New Orleans, Miami, or Los Angeles.
7. **The Trophy.** The idea for the trophy came about in 1966 when Oscar Riedner, a vice president from Tiffany & Co., sketched the design on a napkin during lunch. After Coach Lombardi passed away in 1970, the trophy was officially renamed in his honor, and we know it today as the Vince Lombardi Trophy.
8. **A special coin is made for the coin toss.** It features the Lombardi Trophy and the Super Bowl logo. Famous guests usually flip the coin.
9. **Super Bowl players get fancy cars for the week.** Players on Super Bowl teams often get to drive luxury cars during Super Bowl week.
10. **Halftime performers aren't paid.** The NFL covers the show's costs, but musicians and singers perform for the publicity and the huge audience.


MEET THUNDER THE BRONCOS' MASCOT
